Ted had also advised that the pool pump and motor are being repaired but should be taken care of before camp starts.

Kerri shared that the cabins had been spayed out prior to today (a huge thank you to Kerri and her husband for doing this) and good progress was made Saturday for Camp Clean Up and the balance was completed today. A huge thank you to everyone that helped out. During the clean-up and bed making, several members noticed how thin the sheets were getting and there had been some discussion about the Club looking into replacing these next year.
